10/10/2016 - 2073 Apologies had been received from Cllrs Maggie Keast, Thomas Armitt and Steve McCarthy	
10/10/2016 - 2074 Chair's welcome and introduction. 2074.1. Cllr Laux welcomed all councillors.	
10/10/2016 - 2075 Declarations of Interest by Councillors in items on the Agenda 2075.1. Cllr Fiddian declared an interest in item 2084.1(Planning application 16/P/2084/F) as he lives near the site.	
10/10/2016 - 2076 Minutes of Previous Meeting 2076.1. Cllr McCarthy had asked for his apologies to be added to the previous minutes. Apart from this amendment the minutes of the meeting held on 12th September 2016 were agreed as a true record (proposed Cllr A Scott, seconded Cllr J Scott)	
10/10/2016 - 2077 Crime Report and Neighbourhood Watch 2077.1. PC Martin Faithfull has sent the following report: for Crime figures in Dundry for September 2016 ASB – 0, Non dwelling Burglary – 0, Dwelling Burglary – 1, Theft From Motor Vehicle– 0 Theft Of Motor Vehicle – 0 Criminal Damage– 0 Assault – 0 Theft – 0 Other –(Non Recordable) – 1 Total Incidents reported on REDWOOD BEAT in September – 45 Percentage equating to Dundry 4% Burglary remains a Force Priority especially with the darker evenings approaching. Police remind residents to be vigilant and report anything/anyone acting suspiciously or looking out of place. If residents would like a free Crime Prevention Survey of their homes or property please contact the REDWOOD Beat Team who can arrange this Members of the public can also visit www.police.uk if they wish to review any crime figures for a certain postcode or area. This site is also helpful for crime prevention advice and local issues 2077.2. .The Clerk said that she had received a NW report of a break in to an outbuilding. There were other reports of similar events. Councillors said that there had also been reports of an armed robbery at the Plev Garage. The Clerk was asked to find out more about this. 2077.3. PC Faithfull also reported that he had carried out a letter drop in Crabtree Close asking residents not to park on the pavements. Cllr A Scott said that while this had had the effect of removing the cars from the pavements the turning circle was now even fuller with parked cars. 2077.4. There was again discussion of parking on The Mead. Councillors were pleased to hear that the residents of Spar Cottage were now parking further from the corner but it appeared that school parents were now filling the space in the morning. This was causing problems in particular with the recycling and refuse vehicles. The Clerk was asked to contact the school and ask them to request parents not to park here. 2077.5. With work due to start again on the church the Clerk was asked to contact the church wardens about allowing contractors to park their vehicles in the village car park rather than The Mead as had happened previously. 10/10/2016 - 2078 Public Forum 2078.1. The parishioner present said that he had been in correspondence with the airport about the increasing amount of aeroplane noise over the village, particularly the frequency of flights, but without much success. He had found the complaints section of the BIA website not user-friendly. The Clerk would see if this could be raised at the Airport consultative committee. Councillors thought that it would be useful to find out if other parishioners were aware of and	Clerk

disturbed by increased noise. This problem would only get worse as passenger numbers increased. 2078.2. Cllr Fiddian said that no action had been taken by NSC over the 'waterfall wall' or the overgrown Dundry Lane sign, despite a promise that these would be attended to within three weeks. The Clerk would report this. 2078.3. Cllr Fiddian had received an email from one of the landlords of the Dundry Inn concerning the phone box outside the pub (on their land) which they understood was to be removed by BT. They had asked BT if they could adopt it but received no reply. The Clerk had been told by the BT 'adopt a kiosk' department that the box could be adopted by the pub if they could prove ownership of the land. Councillors had no objection to this proposal and were open to offering assistance in finding an alternative use. The Clerk would send details to Cllr Fiddian to progress this. 2078.4. An email had been received from a parishioner about the lack of cutting of the upper part of the hedge on Broadoak Hill. The clerk would report this to NSC. 2078.5. .Information had been received about alternative arrangements for passengers of the 672 bus while West Dundry Lane was closed for Bristol Water to work. 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10/10/2016 - 2081 Annual Parish Meeting update on issues. 2081.1. Broadband – Cllr Laux had contacted Truespeed about the possibility of using the Bristol Water trench to lay fibre optic cable from Crabtree Lane to the top of Broadoak Hill but received no reply. Meanwhile The BT Openreach website shows cabinet 48 (on Broadoak Hill) in the 'Design' stage for upgrading. 2081.2. Fly tipping – The Clerk said that she had nothing to report from the NSC Community Response Officer about progress on reducing fly tipping. A resident of East Dundry had reported in detail to the police on a potential fly tipping incident which he had probably foiled by showing an interest in what was happening. 2081.2.1. North Somerset Council had recently commenced a consultation on changes in recycling and waste services. In order to save money it was proposed to reduce the opening hours of the recycling centres and charge for DIY waste. Councillors were of the opinion that this would almost certainly cause an increase in fly tipping and/or encourage residents to put DIY waste in their wheelie bins. The Clerk would draft a response to the consultation and circulate it to councillors.(this consultation can be found at www.n-somerset.gov.uk/rc2016) 2081.3. Road Safety in the village – The Clerk was still in the process of checking the NSC map for accuracy in showing speed limits. 2081.4. Parish recycling scheme – Cllr A Scott would shortly be going out with the recycling lorry to see how the recycling is collected. Once she had done this the parish would have met the criteria for the bronze recycling Award (£80). 2081.4.1. The Clerk said that the reuse event (collection of unwanted electrical items and furniture) would be held on 7th November from 4 – 6.30 pm in the village hall car park. 2081.4.2. Registration for the new garden waste service had opened. Residents have until 18th December to register for a maximum of 2 bins at £20 each. After this date the price would go up to £25 and delivery could not be guaranteed by 1st March 2017 when the new scheme starts, Registration is at www.n-somerset.gov.uk/gardenwaste. 2081.5. Footpaths – Cllrs A and J Scott said they had now walked most of the footpaths in the vicinity of the village.
