

North Somerset Specific Places Public Space Protection Orders

Where might they apply?

There are 22 specific public spaces across 10 towns and parishes in North Somerset where new orders/or amendments are proposed.

What happens to any existing orders?

In places where Dog Control Orders already exist and there is no intention to amend them, they will transfer into Public Space Protection Orders, see information relating to [the transition of Dog Control Orders into PSPOs](#)

Who might any new orders/amendments apply to?

Everyone, unless specific exemptions apply within the order.

[Community Association Area](#) – All dogs on leads

Pill & Easton-in-Gordano

[Avon Road Cycle Path](#) – No motorised vehicles

Portbury

[Portbury Nature Reserve](#) – All dogs to be kept to designated paths

Portishead

[Marina](#) – All dogs on leads

[Rodmoor Gardens](#) – All dogs on leads

[Marine Lane](#) – No fishing

Weston-super-Mare

[Weston Beach \(Royal Sands to Weston Pier\)](#) – No dogs between 01 April to 30 September

[High Street](#) – All dogs on leads and no cycling

[Town Centre](#) – No charitable collections/selling of periodicals unless permitted

[The Old Tip](#) – No motorised vehicles

[Princess Royal Square](#) – No skateboarding, scootering, inline skating or roller blading

[Worle Recreation Ground](#) – All dogs on leads (no dogs on the pitch)

Winford & Felton

[Felton Common](#) – No airport parking

Wroughton

[Silver Street Recreation Ground](#) – No dogs

[Glebe Field](#) – All dogs on leads

Yatton & Claverham

[The Strawberry Line](#) – No motorised vehicles without permission

What happens when someone fails to comply with the PSPO

A person will commit an offence if, without reasonable excuse, they do something which is prohibited by the PSPO or fails to comply with the requirement of a PSPO.

The maximum penalty for breaching a PSPO is a fine of £1,000.

An authorised officer may however issue a fixed penalty notice (FPN) to anyone he or she has reason to believe has breached the PSPO. The FPN will give the person 14 days to pay the fine. Payment of the FPN would discharge any liability to conviction for the offence.

The FPN can specify two amounts, a lower one if paid within 10 days and a maximum higher amount if paid after 10 days.

North Somerset proposes to set the lower amount at £50 and the higher amount at £75.
