Crime Report and Neighbourhood Watch Verbal report on behalf of PCSO Mike Jordan. There has been some action taken against motorists at Hill Road, there has been one complaint about anti-social behaviour there. Also a reminder to be vigilant this time of year.	
Public Forum Statement from a resident of Yanleigh Close, comments about the road closures as a consequence of the Truespeed installation, as well as the need to get rid of weeds around the church. Clerk to alert NSC about this. Dundry Litter-busters reported that 3 big litter picks had taken place, that residents were saying that the village looked better & that they were grateful for the support from the Parish Council. There was a discussion about future activities & funding, which included how North Somerset Council should be asked to clear Broad Oak Hill, as this was too dangerous because of traffic, was there the possibility of signage, could the Environment Agency help & could the Airport sponsor a clean-up on the A38. Volunteers were going in pairs to the Hill Road turning circle, where there continues to be a need for rubbish bins. Cllr McCarthy said will be a discussion at the September meeting of the Parish Council about this. Cllr Laux asked that NSC should empty bins as their contribution, Clerk to contact John Carson at NSC to progress this. There were positive comments about the about traffic safety measures on the A38, clerk to pass these on to NSC. The fencing around the playground, that has been recently repaired, has been damaged again by children climbing.
