<u>Chair’s welcome and introduction</u> Cllr Laux welcomed all to the meeting, which is being held online in the current coronavirus crisis.

<u>Crime Report and Neighbourhood Watch</u> There are regular newsletters from the PCC, as well as a more specific local newsletter from the PCOs. The PCSO was contacted to join an online parish meeting, unfortunately the police do not allow Zoom technology to be used on their devices	
<u>Public Forum</u> A resident has contacted DPC about possible development at ‘Broad Oak House’, Clerk to contact NSC about a possible planning breach. Hill Road – Cllr James Tonkin, exec member NSC, has been in contact be email & by telephone about the issue of installing an electronic gate. He is consulting officers & will be in touch. Councillors agreed that ‘Hill Road’ should be a separate agenda item for future meetings.	Clerk
<u>Councillors items</u> Cllr Fiddian raised the flooding problem on Bridgewater Road. This has been notified to NSC on a number of occasions, but yet to be resolved. Clerk to inform NSC again. Cllr Laux reported that the wall at the hairpin bend on Dundry Hill has collapsed again. Clerk to inform NSC. Cllr Waite reported that a Bristol City Council leaflet is showing all of Dundry as an ‘open green space’ for walking etc. This isn’t correct & will put additional pressure on local facilities. Clerk to contact Bristol City Council to correct this for future editions. Cllr Waite reminded councillors that NSC were contacted about the locked gate restricting access onto Dundry Downs some time ago. NSC have agreed that this isn’t acceptable & are in contact with the landowner, but as yet no action has been taken. Clerk to ask what progress	Clerk Clerk Clerk Clerk
